Situated on the seafront, our hotel is a short walk from the harbour and town centre.

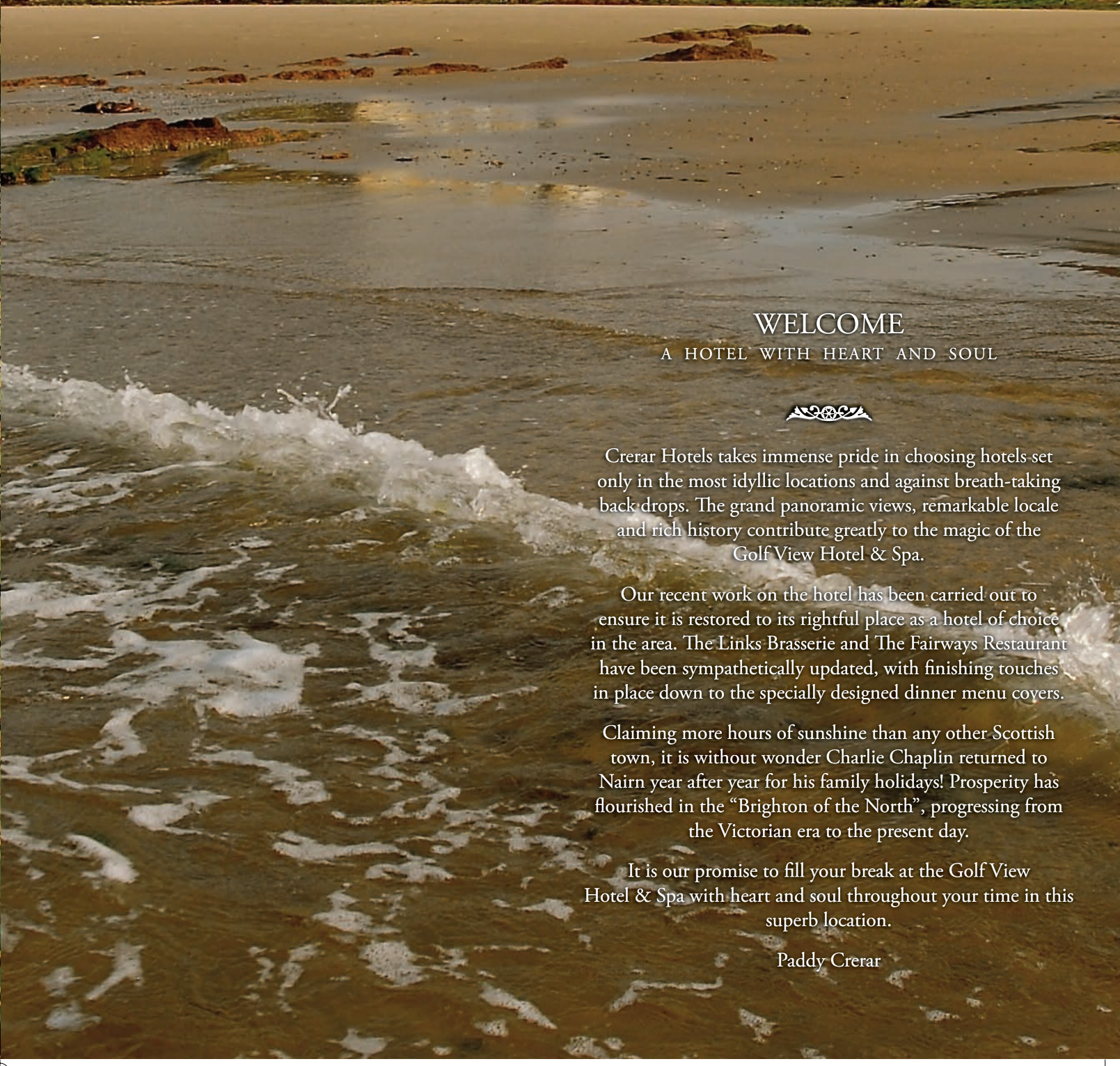
FROM THE WEST – Follow the A96 from Inverness to Nairn. Stay on the A96 entering Nairn, turning left into Seabank Road immediately after the Parish Church. Follow Seabank Road to the end and the hotel is situated on your right hand side.

FROM THE EAST – Follow the A96 into Nairn. At the roundabout take first left and continue to follow the A96. Continue through the next set of traffic lights and after 1/4 mile turn right into Seabank Road, immediately before the Parish Church. Follow Seabank Road to the end and the hotel is situated on your right hand side.

Nearest railway station: Nairn Railway Station (approx 1.3 miles)

Nearest airport: Inverness (Dalcross) Airport (approx 9 miles)

GOLF

Within just over a mile of each other, and easy walking distance from the hotel, lie the excellent facilities of two championship golf courses. Together Nairn Golf Club and Nairn Dunbar Golf Course provide a challenging and enjoyable test for all standards of players, from novices to the world's top amateurs and professionals. Castle Stuart Golf Club in nearby Inverness and Royal Dornoch Golf Club, Dornoch, also offer excellent facilities and welcome non-members, as do a further assortment of challenging golf clubs throughout the area.

SEA & WILDLIFE

Have fun on Nairn's award-winning sandy beaches, reputed in the past to contain amazing medicinal and healing properties attracting visitors from all around. Explore the many rock pools for wildlife or look out for the dolphins and other stunning sea life occupying the local waters from the unique, sandy dunes, Nairn Harbour or Chanonry Point.

WHISKY

Guests are encouraged to sample some malt whisky with a dram or two at many of the distilleries in the area. Benromach Distillery is the smallest working distillery in Speyside and is open all year round. Dallas Dhu is another distillery nearby where guests can visit and tour around. The area is perfectly situated for the famous Malt Whisky Trail, or visit a multitude of distilleries from the comfort of the Golf View Hotel & Spa bar.

HISTORY

Nairn is a town steeped in rich history. Tourism began to prosper here in the Victorian times, encouraging the moniker of "Brighton of the North". The tales of the healing medicinal sea water of the majestic Moray Firth also worked wonders for the town's popularity. Today, there are many nearby historic castles and attractions to visit, including Cawdor Castle, Fort George and Culloden Battlefield, with the city of Inverness only a short drive away.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

Outdoor activities are well catered for in the area with some excellent walking routes available among the rivers, woods and hills. A network of signposts designed for cyclists run along rural and urban routes, local stables provide horse riding and pony trekking, and being a sea-side town, water sports are well covered with an active sailing club, kayaking and windsurfing to name a few. Angling is also popular, whether carried out from boat, pier or shore. There is also a well stocked fishery just three miles out of town.
