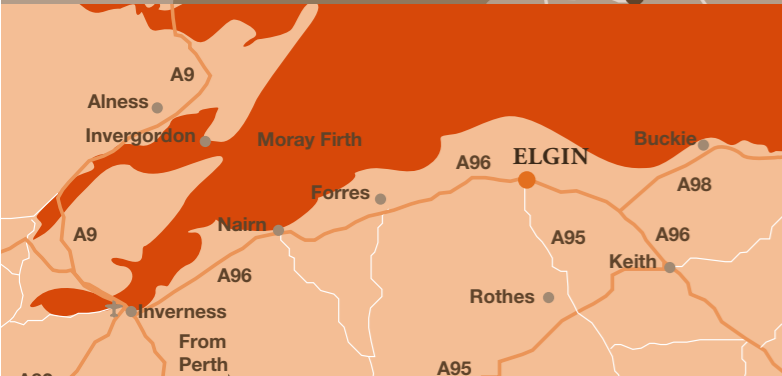


DIRECTIONS

BY CAR – Follow the A96 Inverness to Aberdeen road. Our location is on the junction of Morrison Road, turning left on approach from Inverness.

BY RAILWAY – Taxi from Elgin railway station (5 mins approx). If walking (20 mins approx), take the road to the left from the station, turning left at the second roundabout onto the A96 towards Inverness.

BY PLANE – From Inverness (Dalcross) airport (36 miles), follow the approach to the main Aberdeen to Inverness road (A96). From Aberdeen (Dyce) Airport, follow signs for Inverness (60 miles approx to Elgin).
