

DIRECTIONS

Pitlochry is just off the main A9 road, halfway between Edinburgh and Inverness. There are two turn-offs from the A9 into Pitlochry. If you arrive from the south, turn right (or turn left from the north) off the main street, Atholl Road, into Bonnethill Road. Scotland's Hotel is 100 metres up on the right with the car park entrance just before the hotel.

Main roads to hotel: A9, A924
Nearest railway station: Pitlochry (1/2 mile)
Nearest airport: Edinburgh (67 miles)

At Scotland's Hotel & Leisure Club we will put our heart and soul into giving you a classic hotel in a classic location, making your stay here truly memorable whenever you visit.

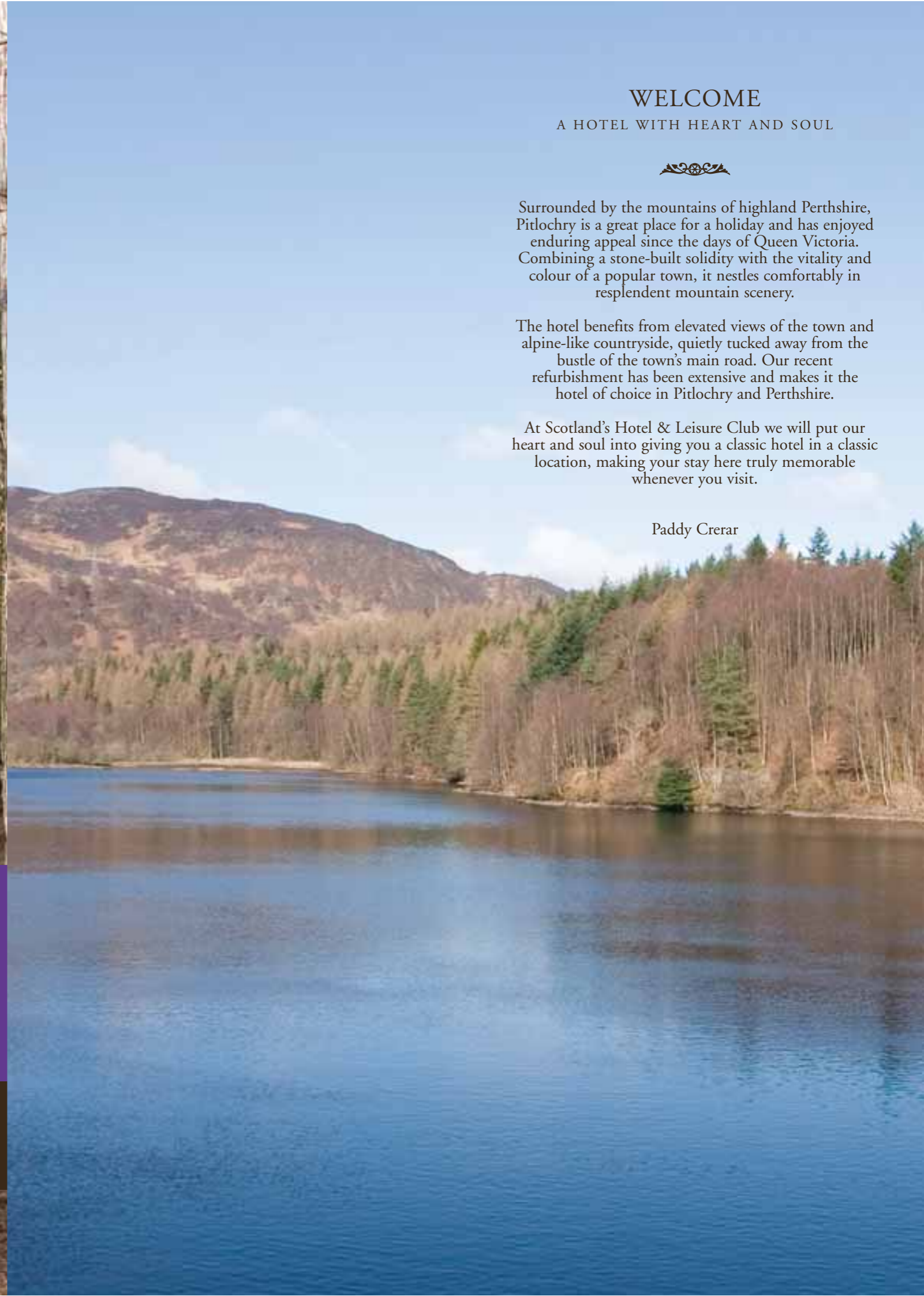

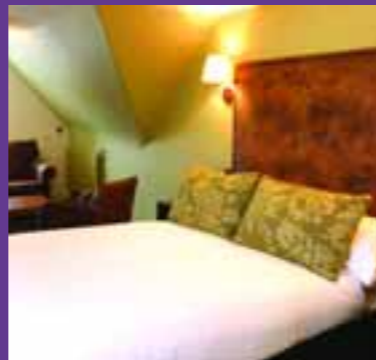
MACNAB'S BISTRO AND BAR

GOLF

Perthshire has a vast golfing heritage and offers the challenge of 40 courses, most of which can be enjoyed with the purchase of a local golfing pass. In addition, St. Andrews and Carnoustie are within easy reach of Pitlochry.

WATERSPORTS

Canoeing, kayaking, canyoning, gorge-walking and whitewater rafting are all available locally and offer truly unforgettable days out.

THEATRE

The Pitlochry Festival Theatre offers a repertoire season of everything from comedies and thrillers to Shakespeare.

WALKING

There are plenty of mapped local trails to follow. For an easy walk through woodland, The Hermitage is ten minutes from the hotel, or for something more strenuous the Catevan Trail and Rob Roy Way are for serious long-distance walkers.

CYCLING

Highland Perthshire is ideal for two-wheeled exploration, whether on estate tracks, excellent quiet roads or off road trails. Local routes include the Pass of Killiecrankie, Loch Tay and Loch Tummel and Atholl Estates.

SKI-ING

Within easy reach of Pitlochry are 3 of Scotland's main ski centres at Glenshee, the Lecht and Cairngorm. Enjoy a day on the piste or get active with some snow-boarding.

WHISKY

Scotland's smallest distillery at Edradour (just 12 casks produced a week) and Blair Atholl Distillery both make fascinating visits.

TOURING

There is almost too much to do in and around Pitlochry – castles, palaces, gardens, museums, adventure centres and wildlife parks all vie for your attention. We can also offer an extensive range of outdoor activities through our association with 'Nae Limits'.
